
### Band
























French Club



We also carried on our yearly projects of raising broilers and farming of 20 acres of land. We also managed the greenhouse. This year we planted 900 trees on the new high school building site.

































To be a privileged member of the Neville Hart Chapter of the National Honor Society, a student must secure a 3.0 or better average in his freshman and sophomore year.


Students are selected by the faculty not for their scholastic achievements alone, but for their leadership and loyalty to the school.

The following week students filed into the gym to listen to the speeches of the students running for an assembly office. Finally the voting was held and the results came in. Good luck to the winners who will be running things next year.













































ORTHOPEDIC DEAF



















































Fall Sports Assembly


most Improved and for Mike Schneirla and Frank






Spring Sports Banquet

Although Brazil is quite different from the United States, Heilva has adjusted very well to our society.




























Commencement
