The maintenance men and women work day and night to keep THS clean. The men handle the boilers and also repairs. They keep our school standing.



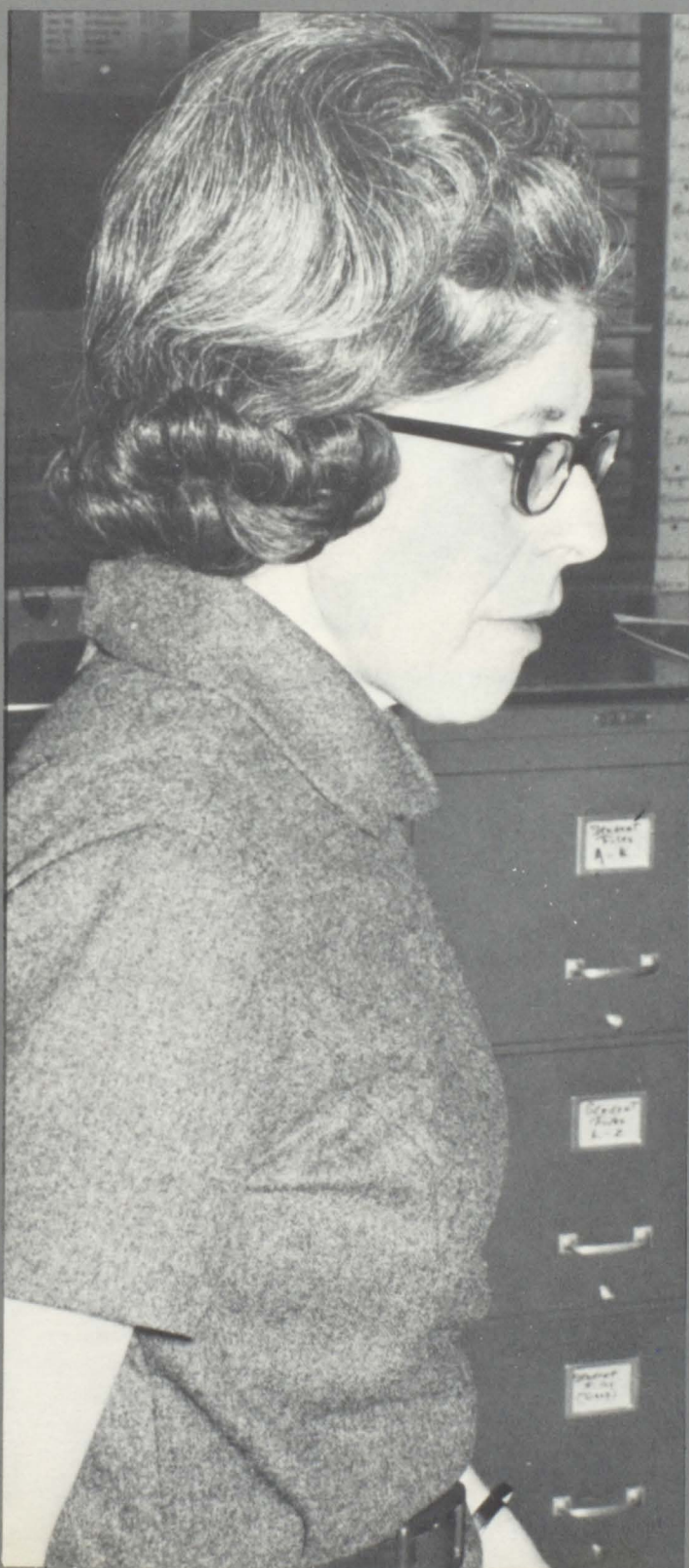

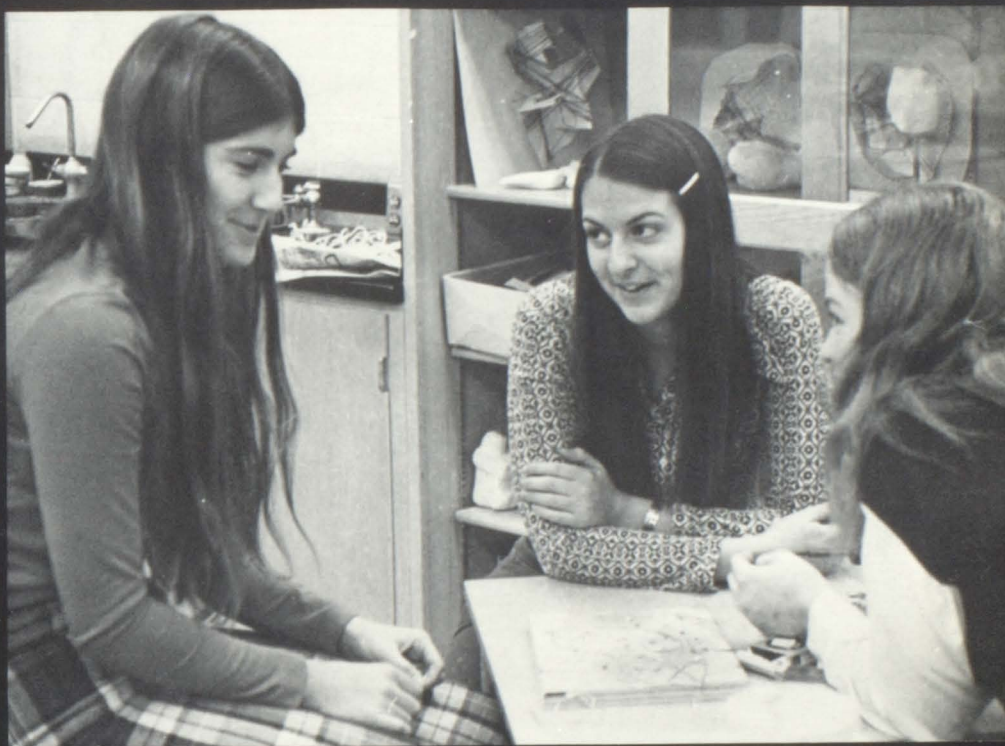
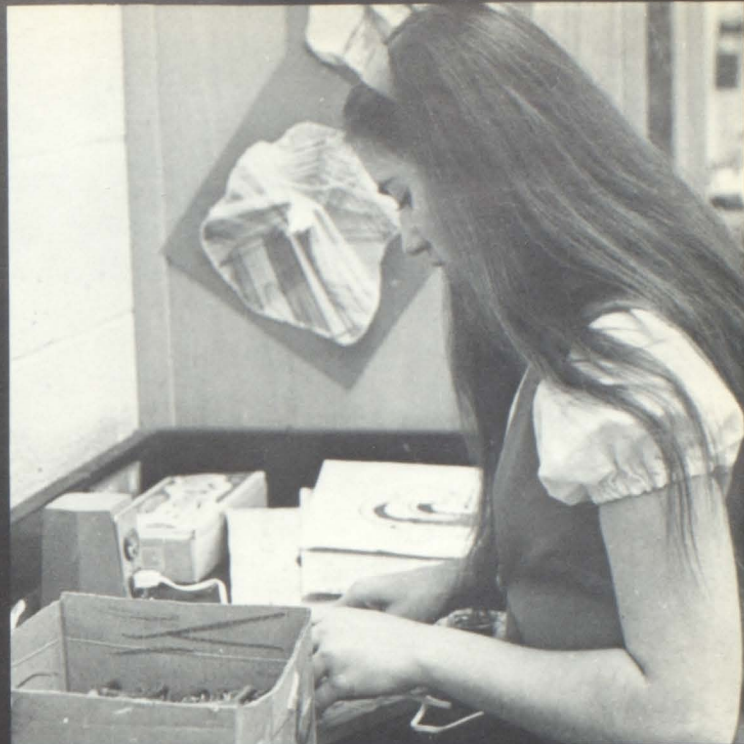
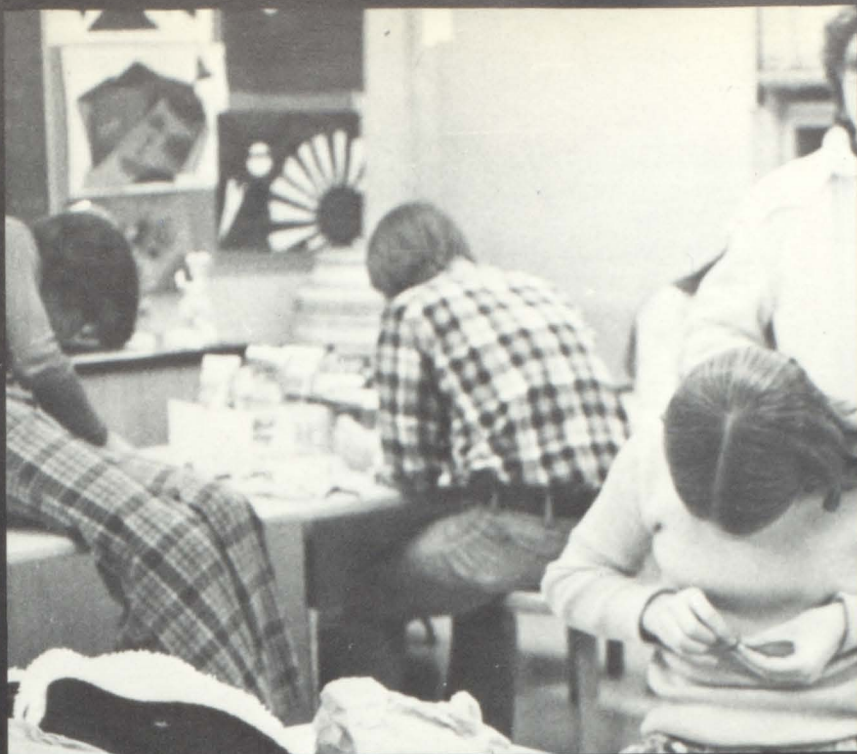




PEP CLUB

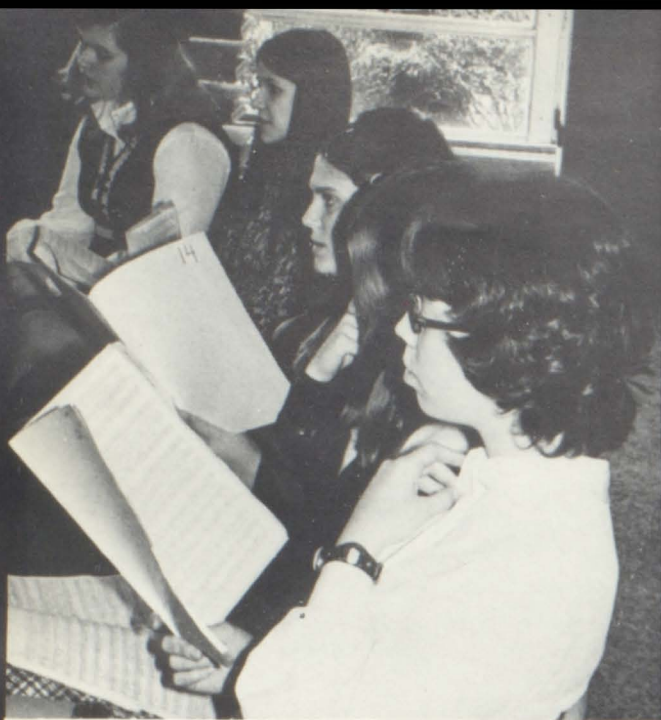


Band

The French club again this year played a key role in our school activities throughout the year.



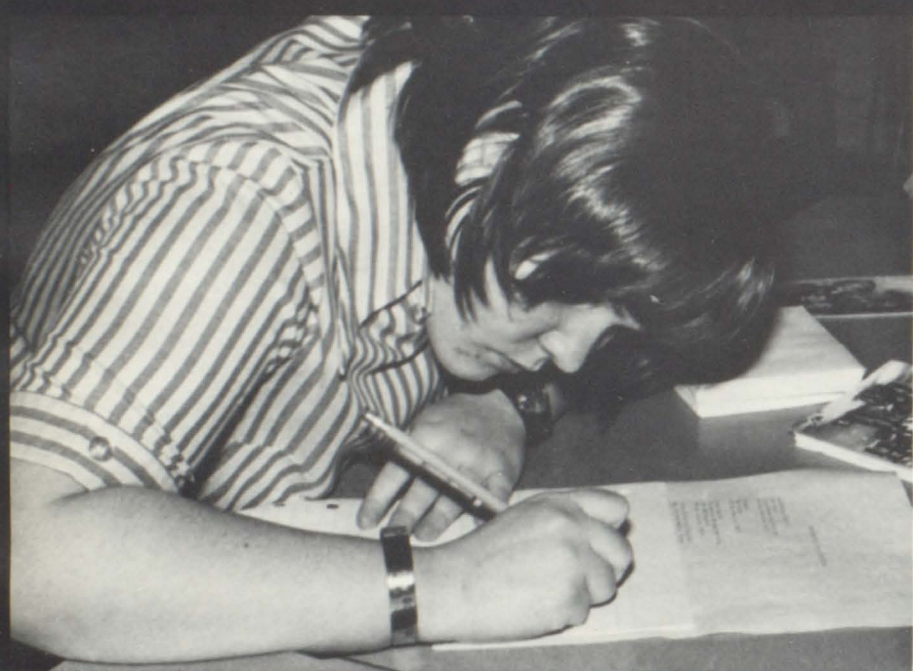


SPANISH CLUB

We also carried on our yearly projects of raising broilers and farming of 20 acres of land. We also managed the greenhouse. This year we planted 900 trees on the new high school building site.

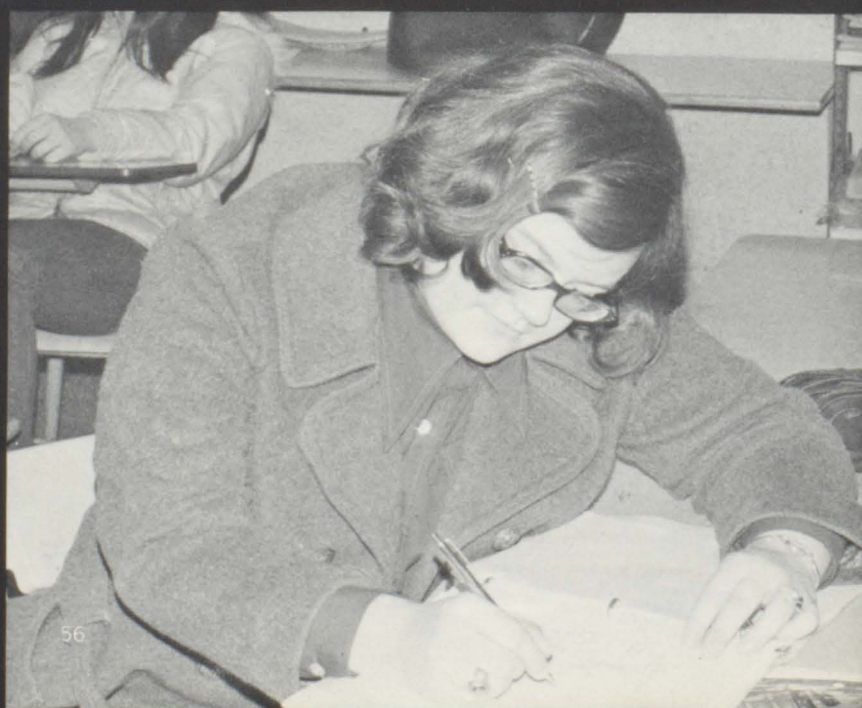
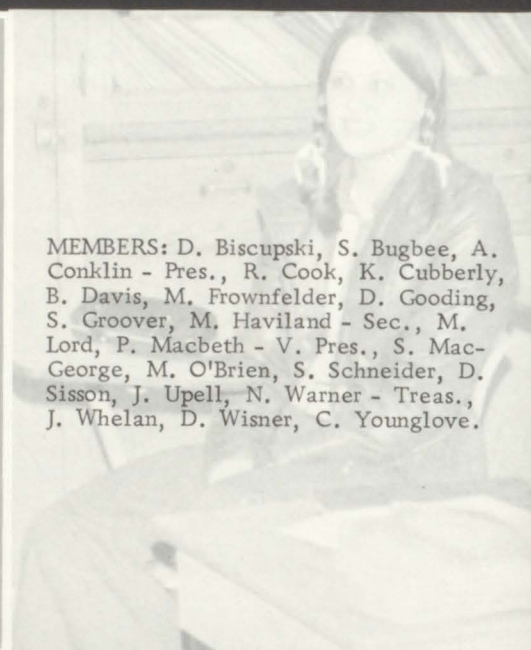

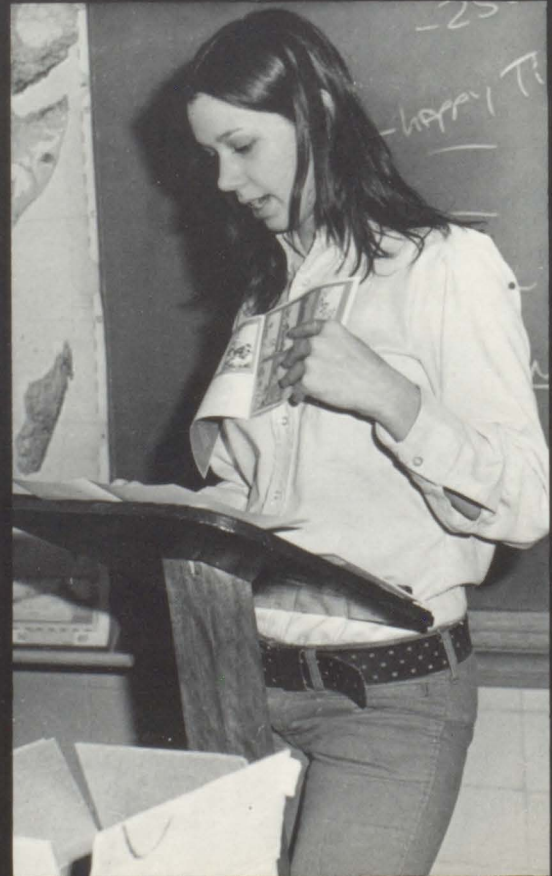
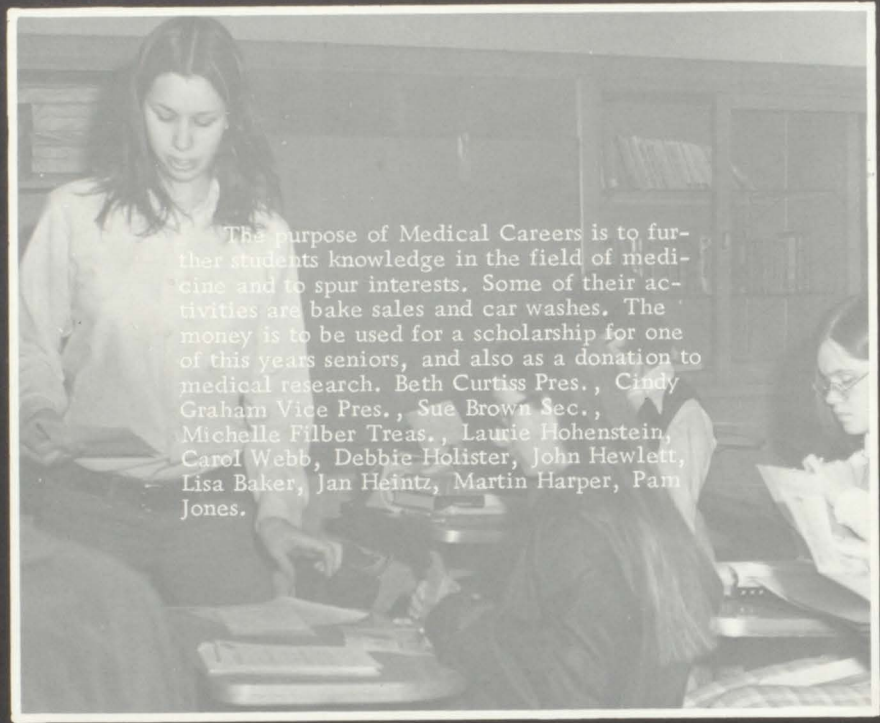


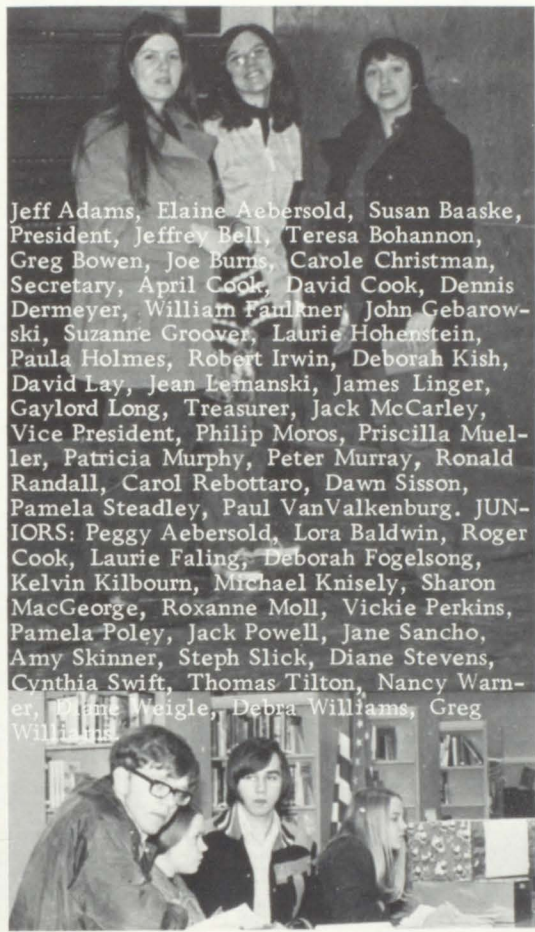


GAA

ORTHOPEDIC DEAF

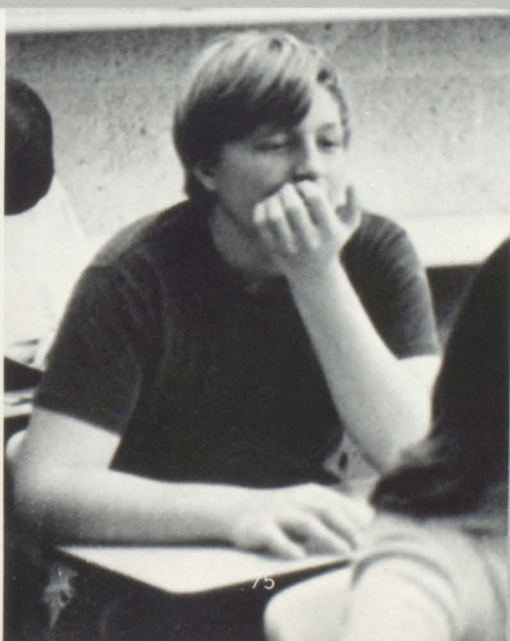
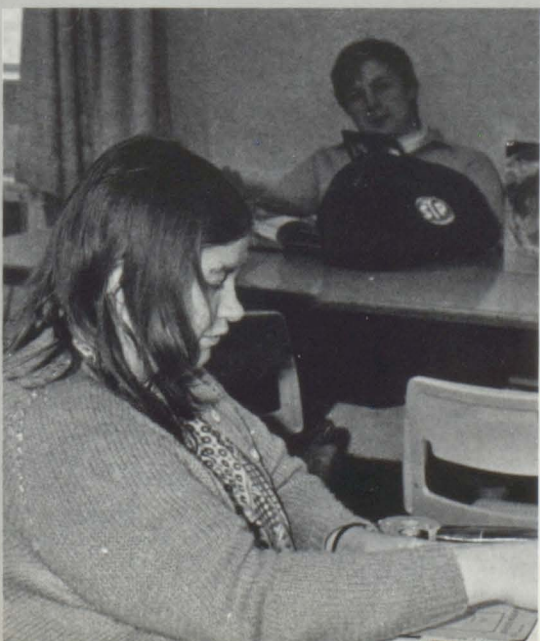
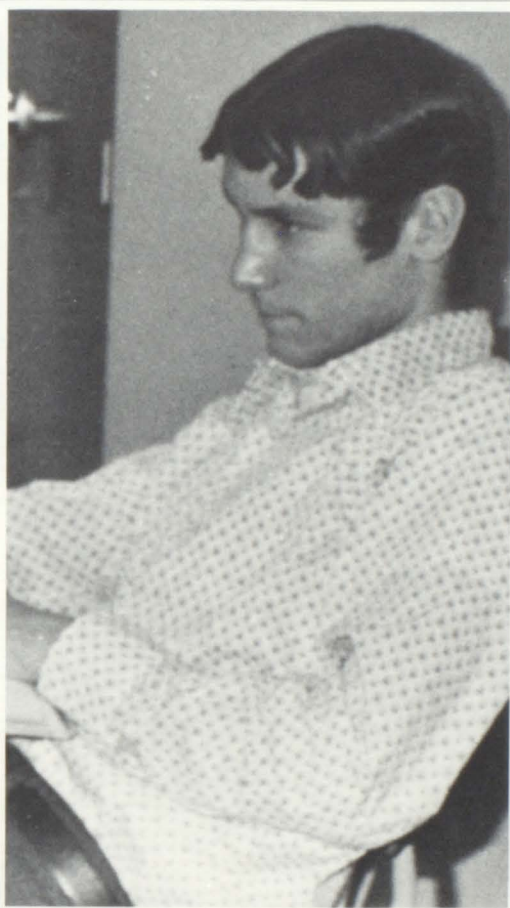
Students from all areas of Lenawee County are bussed to the Orthopedic Room here at Tecumseh High School. This is the only classroom in the county for physically handicapped and deaf students of Jr. High and High School age.

This year, there are 16 students, four who are deaf and 12 orthopedically handicapped.

The students are on regular academic programs but many must use wheel chairs or crutches for transportation. An elevator enables them to get to classes on the second floor. A teacher aid, Mrs. Pat Rittenhouse, helps get the students to their classes.

The students are integrated for at least one subject. Many of them, in spite of their handicaps, are able to maintain above average to superior grades. Four boys will graduate with the rest of the seniors this June.

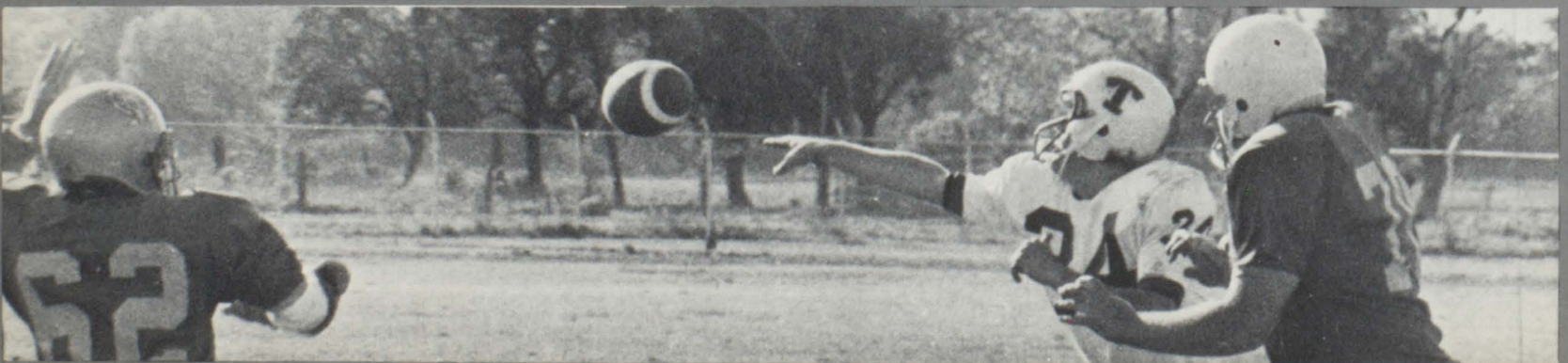
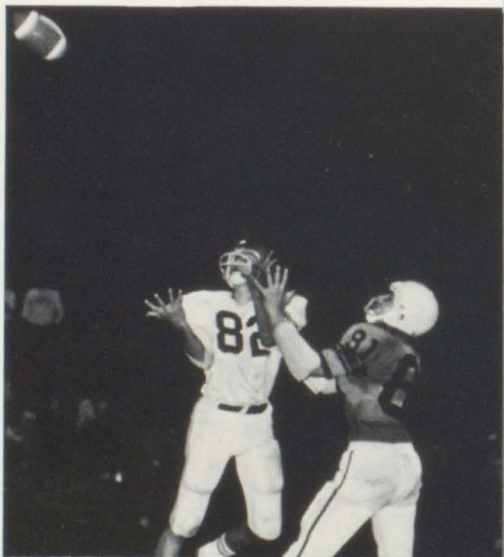


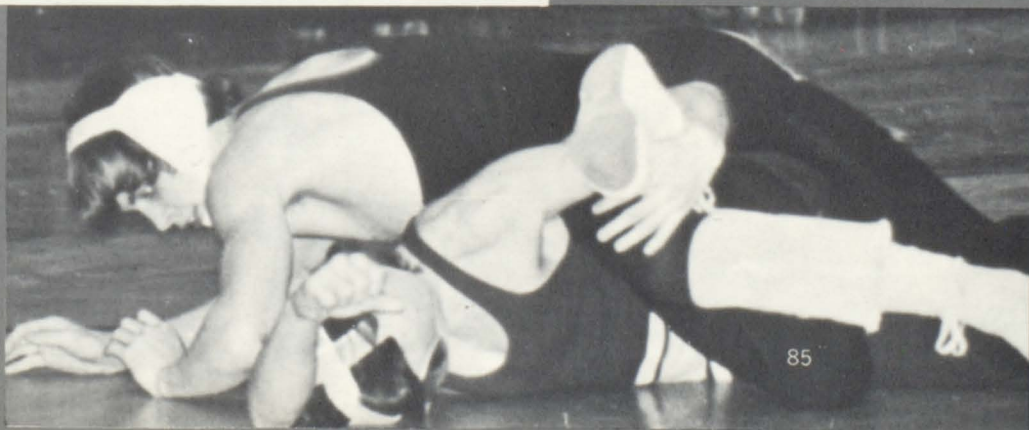
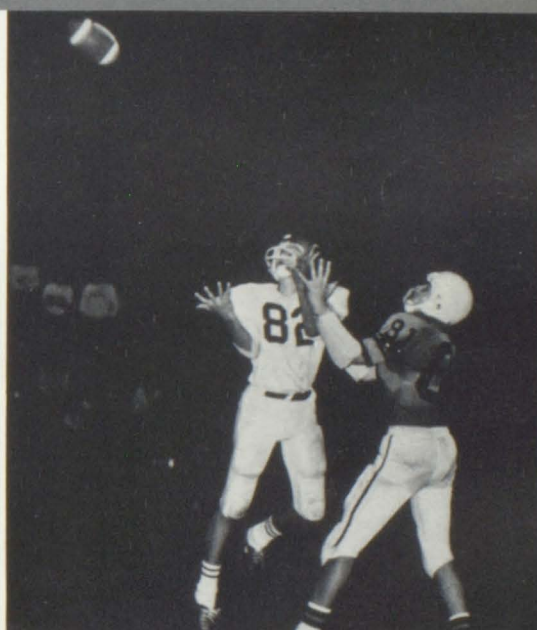
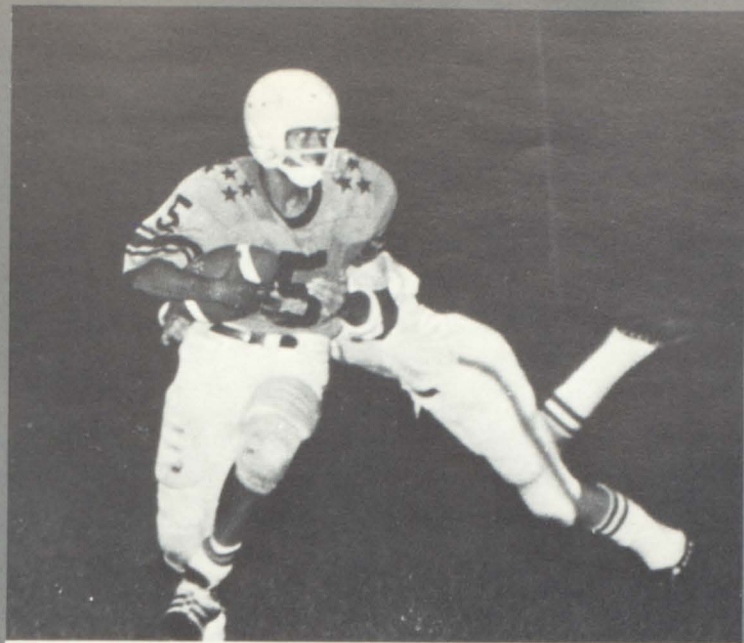
Cross Country

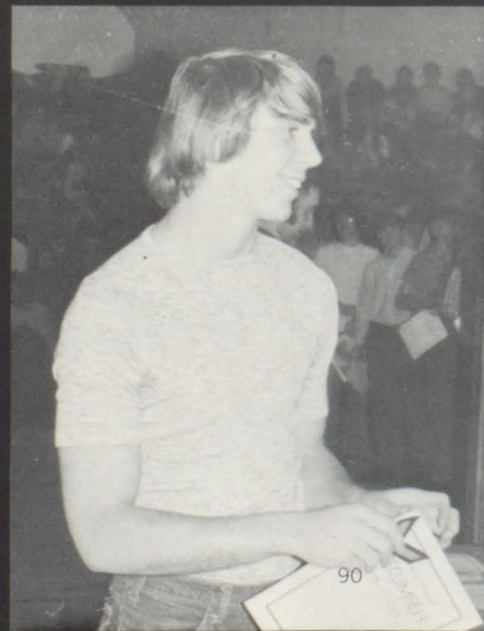
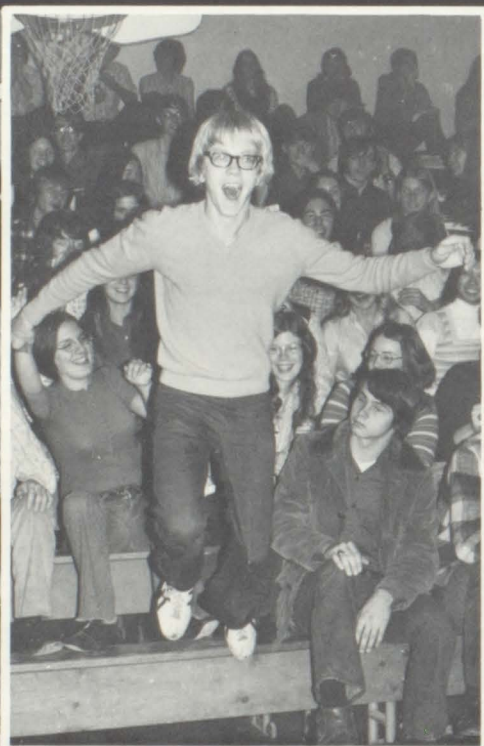


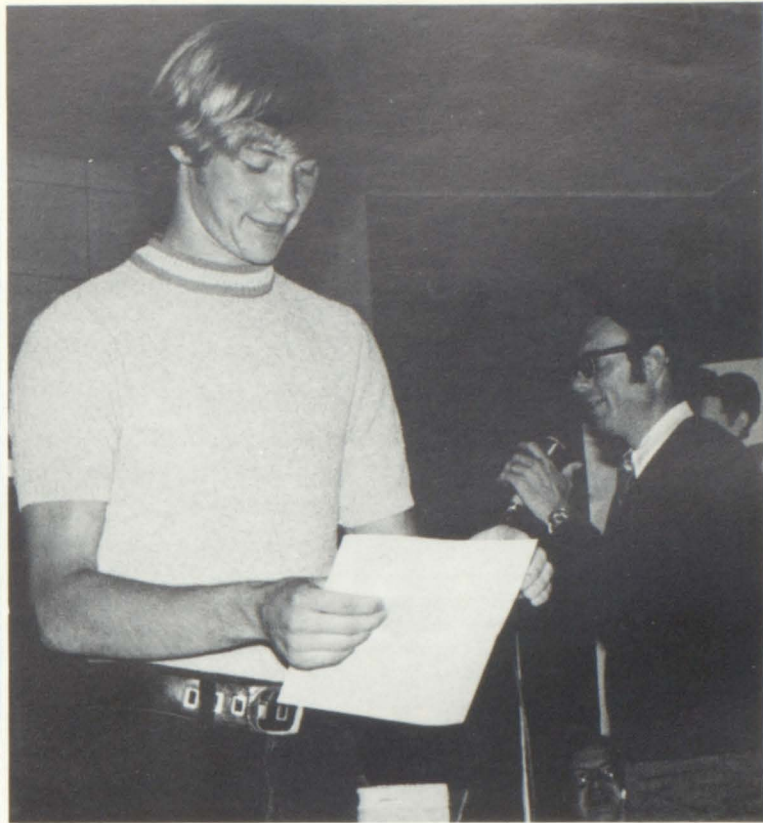
Fall Sports Assembly

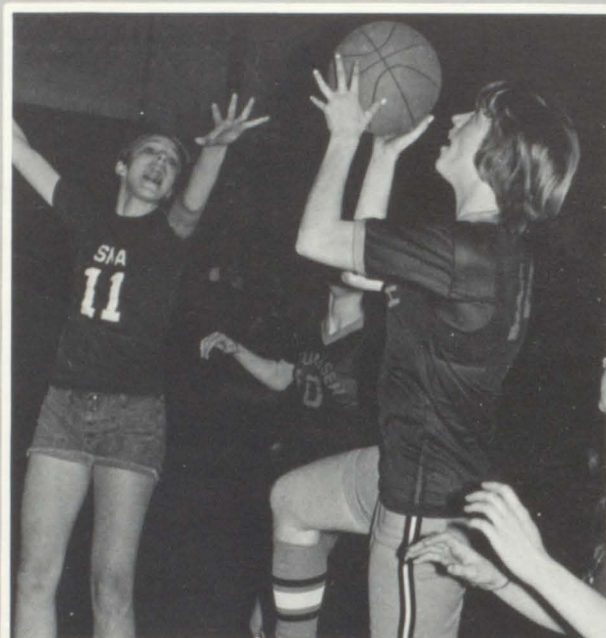


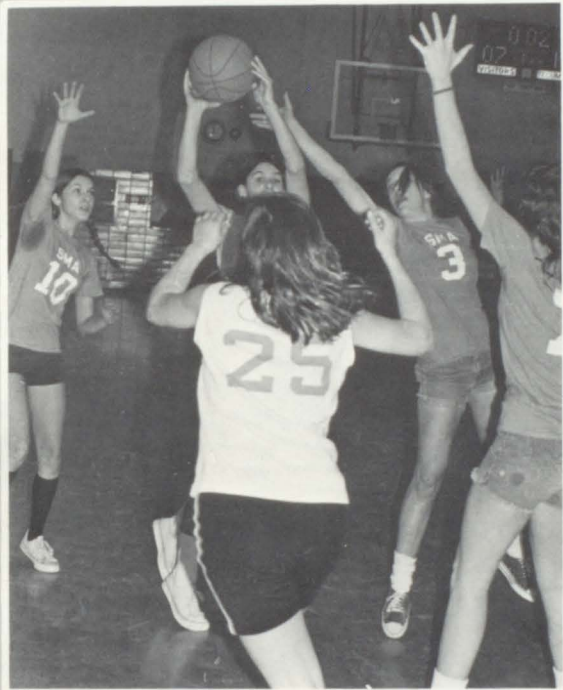
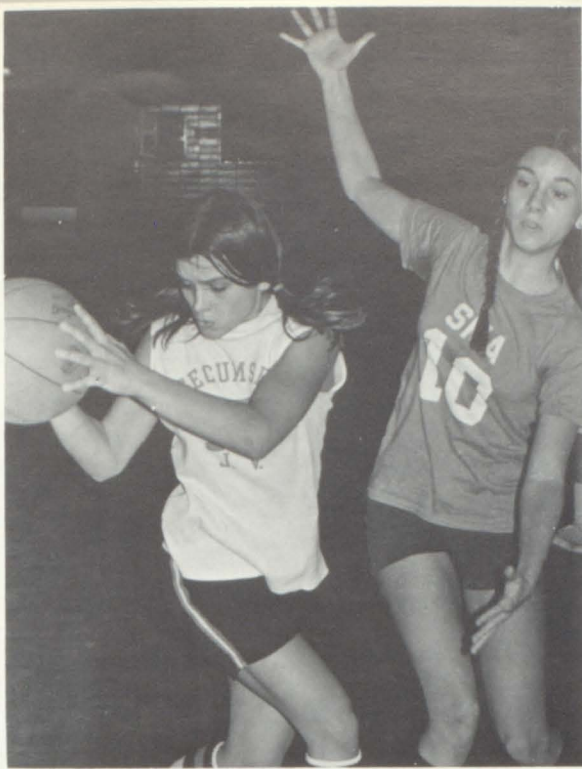
Varsity And JV Girls Basketball

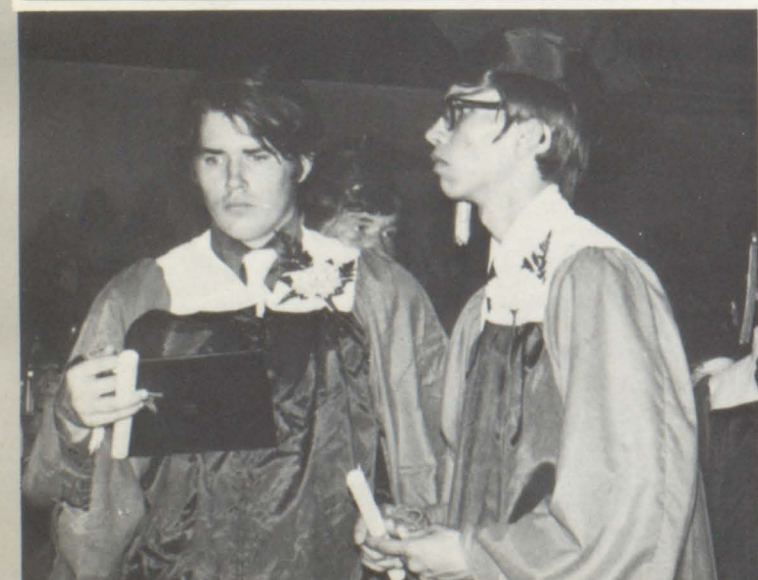


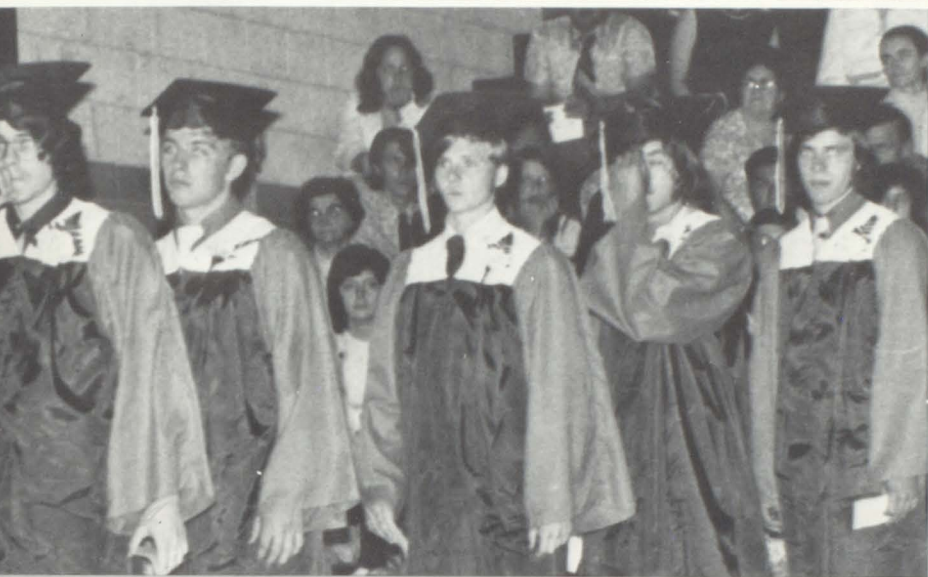





Commencement
