




FOREIGN EXCHANGE STUDENTS












FALL PLAY














VO-TECH
























GIRLS' STATE




TALENT SHOW



who would be honored with an






TEACHER OF THE YEAR
















SHOOT YOURSELF

















Junior/Senior Prom


The Tecumseh High School










CLASS NIGHT
