



















FALL PLAY

FOREIGN EXCHANGE STUDENTS


















SPONGE WEEK



JUNIOR ACHIEVEMENT


Junior Achievement is an extremely popular and successful program in Tecumseh.









STUDENT COUNCIL

Following the game was the traditional Homecoming dance, sponsored by the Student Council. The featured band was Jam Pact. All in all, Homecoming was a total success.








































ORANGE SPIRAL




Because a yearbook is the only permanent record of high school memories, a lot of time, work, and imagination must be put forth in order to make the book a good one.


The night was warm and breezy, and the building was beautifully decorated with bright lights and peachy, Spring-like colors.














































EDITORS' NOTE
