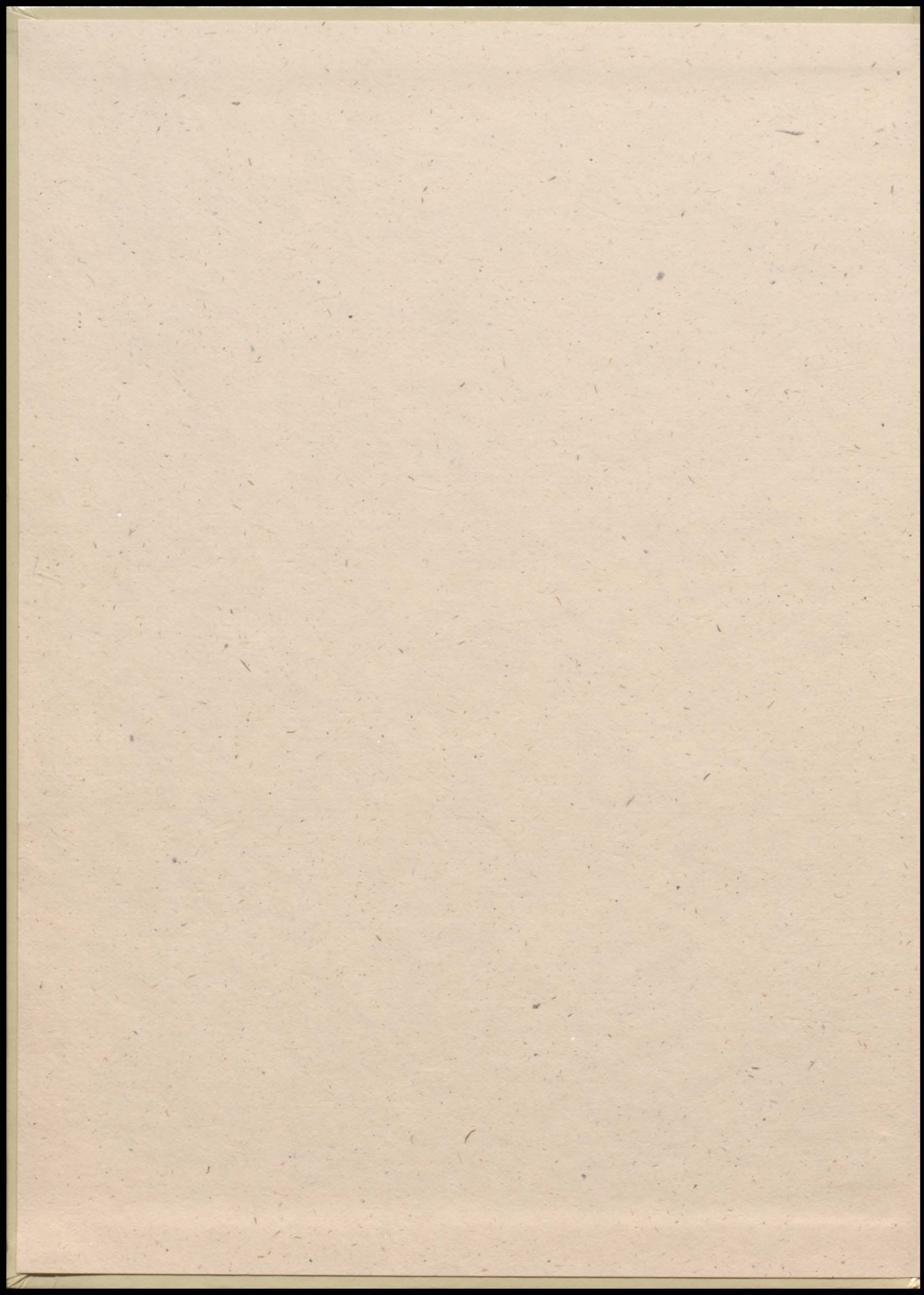
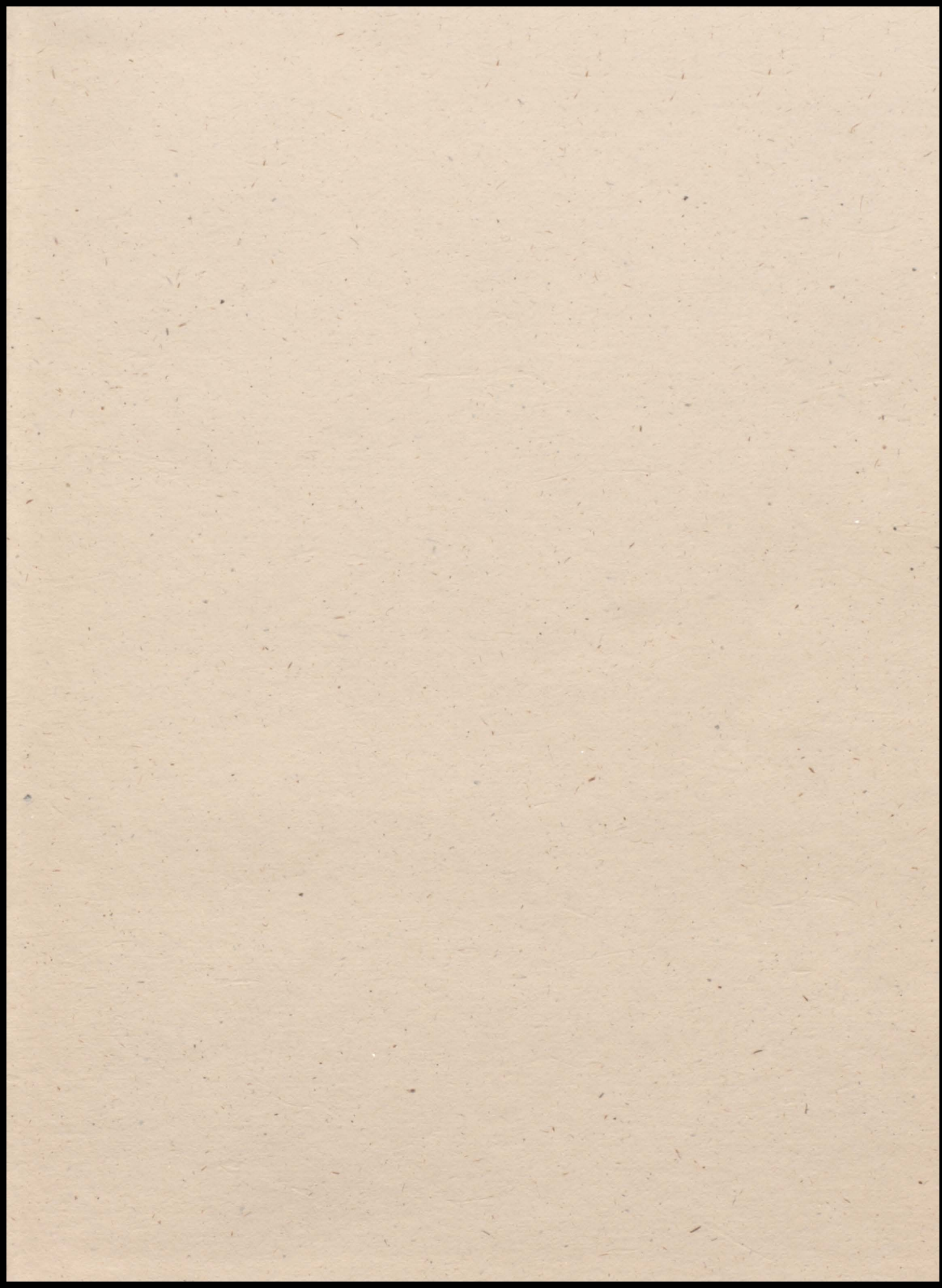


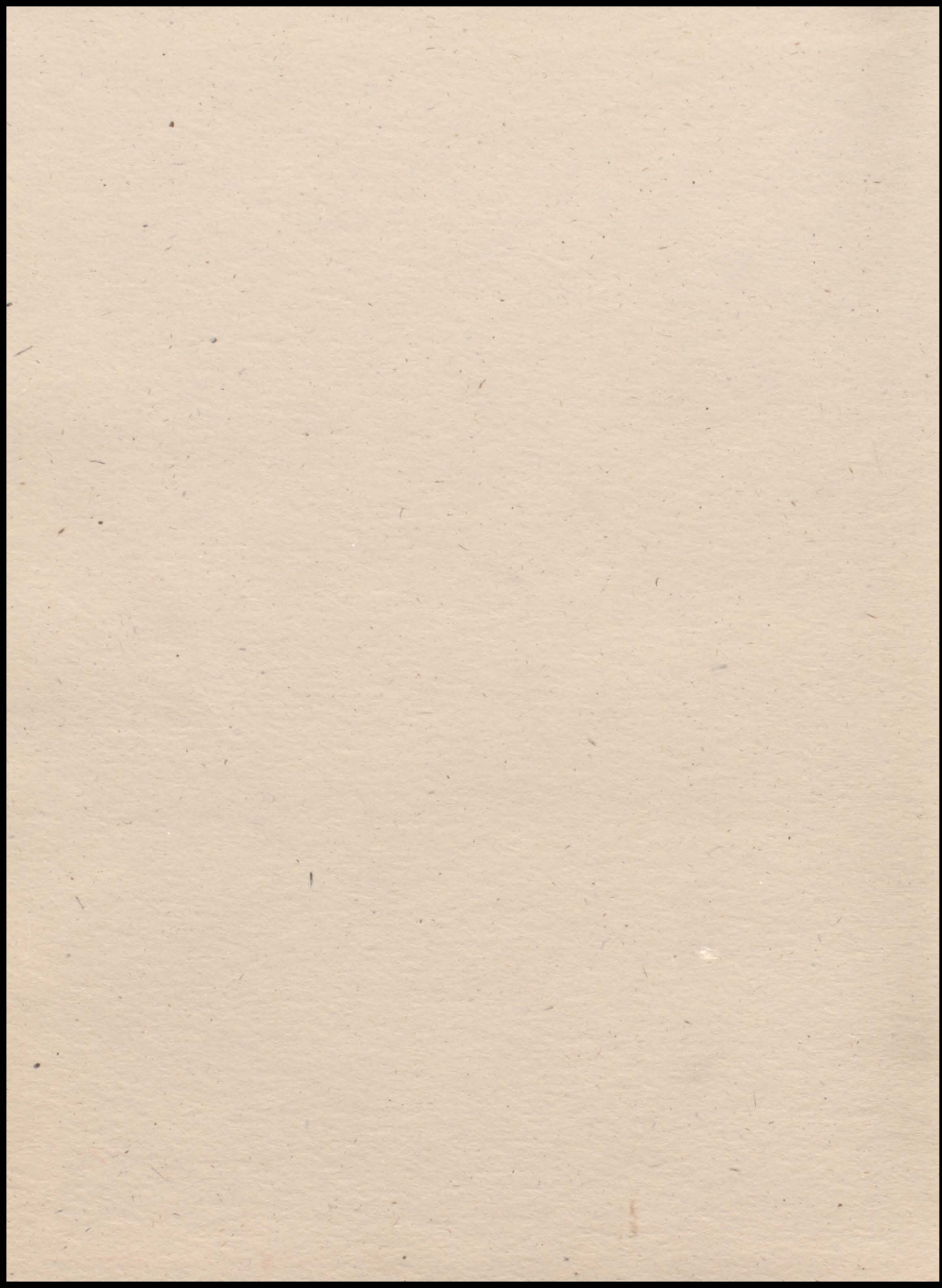

Was now a runway*

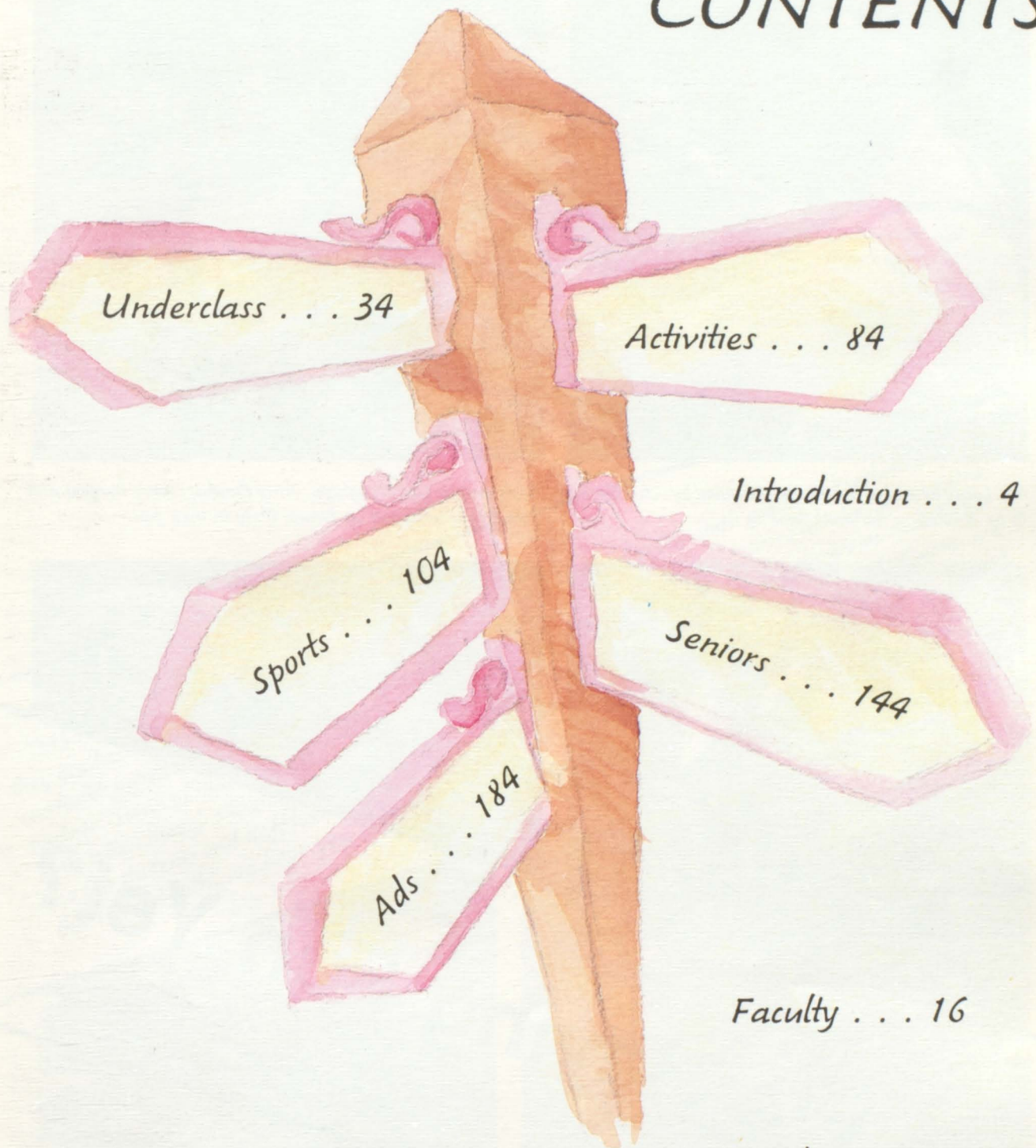

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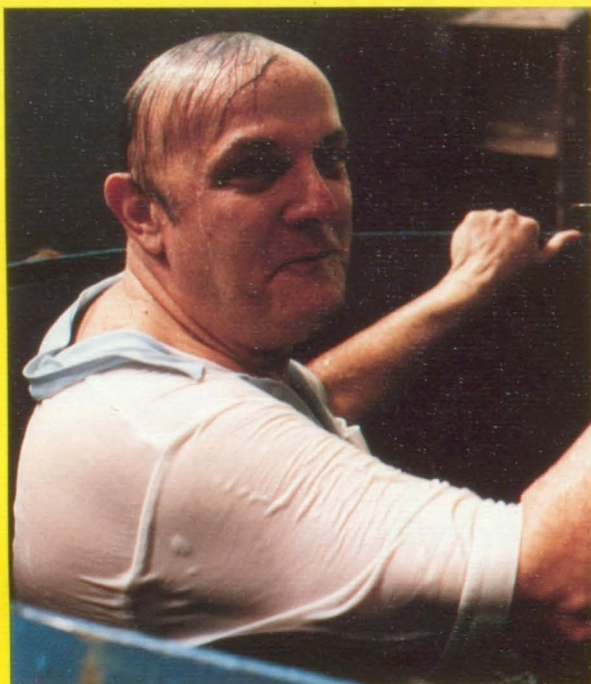

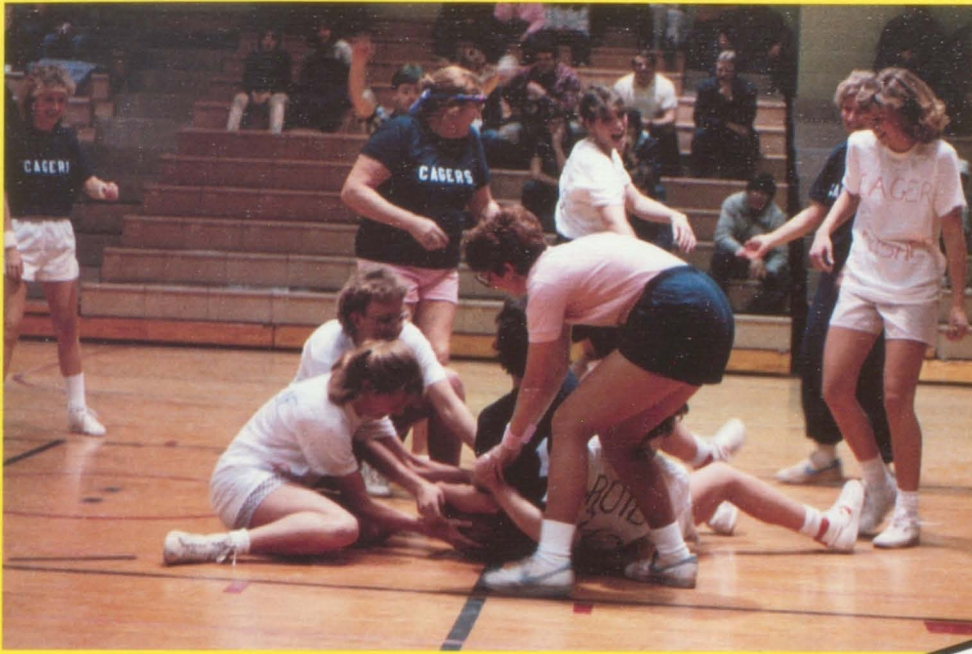

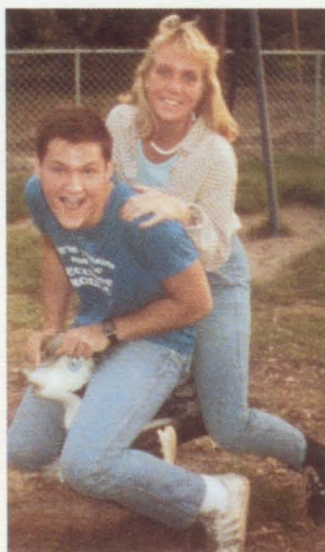

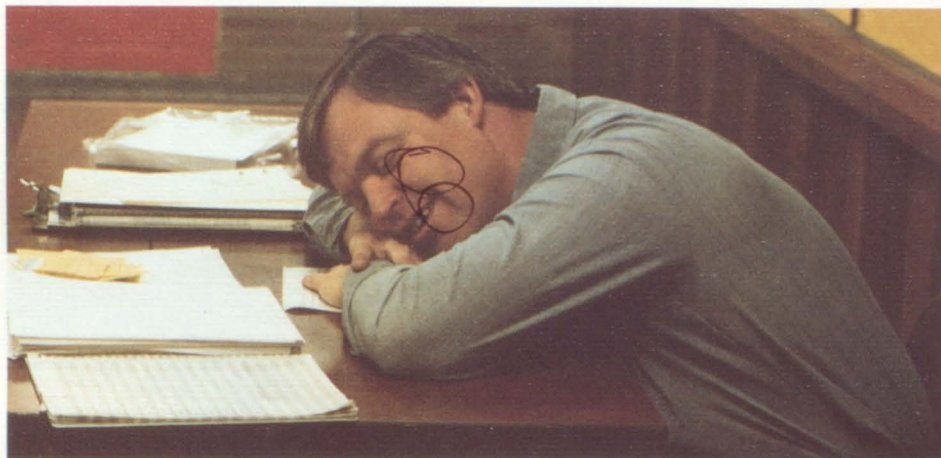

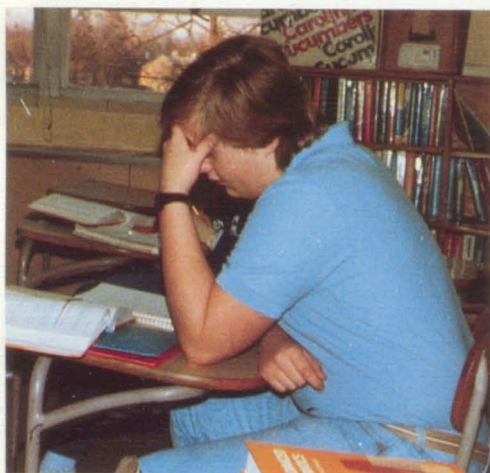

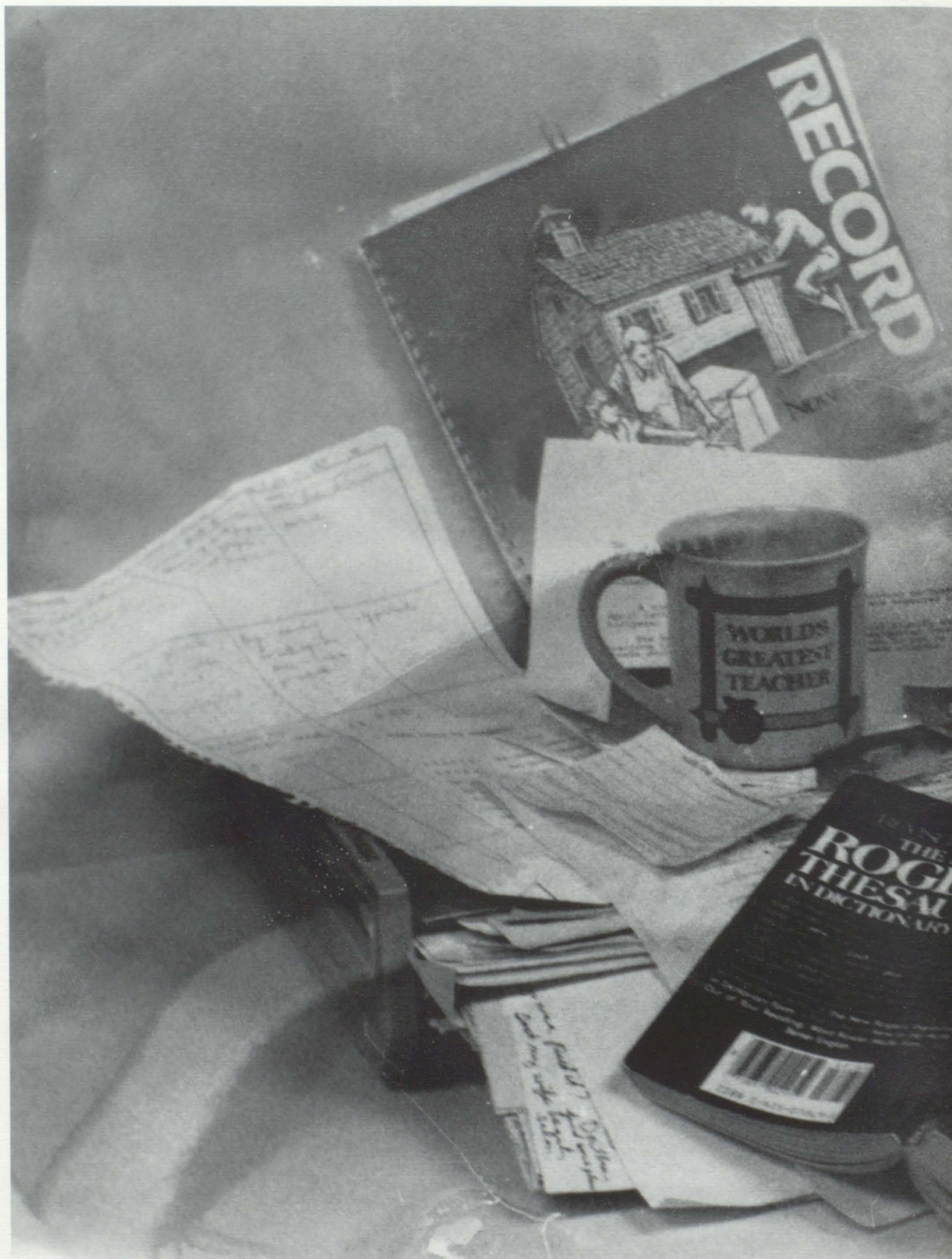

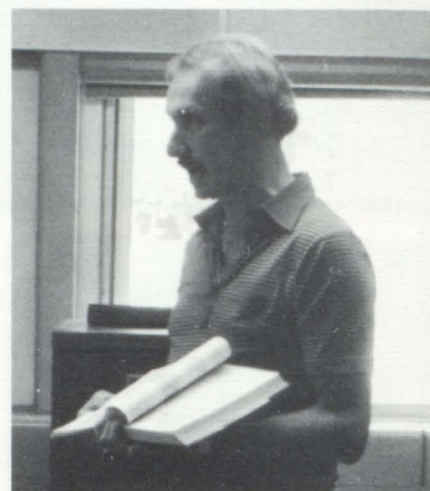

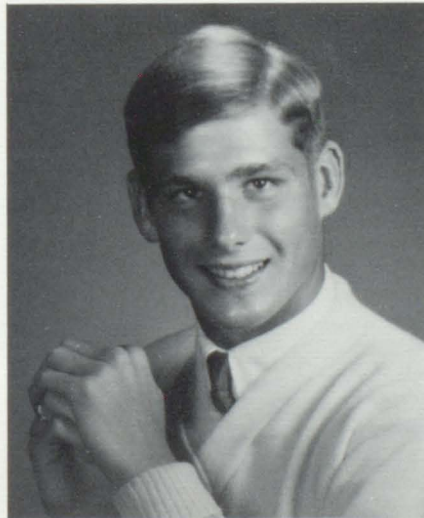
In my spare time I enjoy being with my family. Watching and

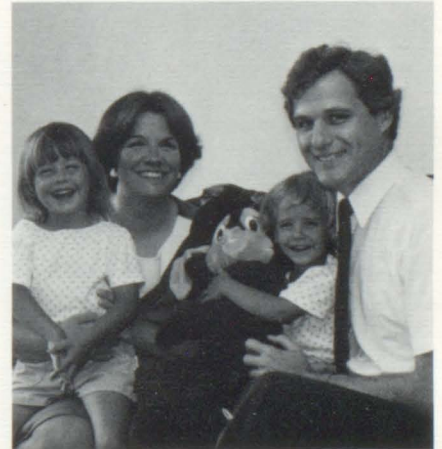

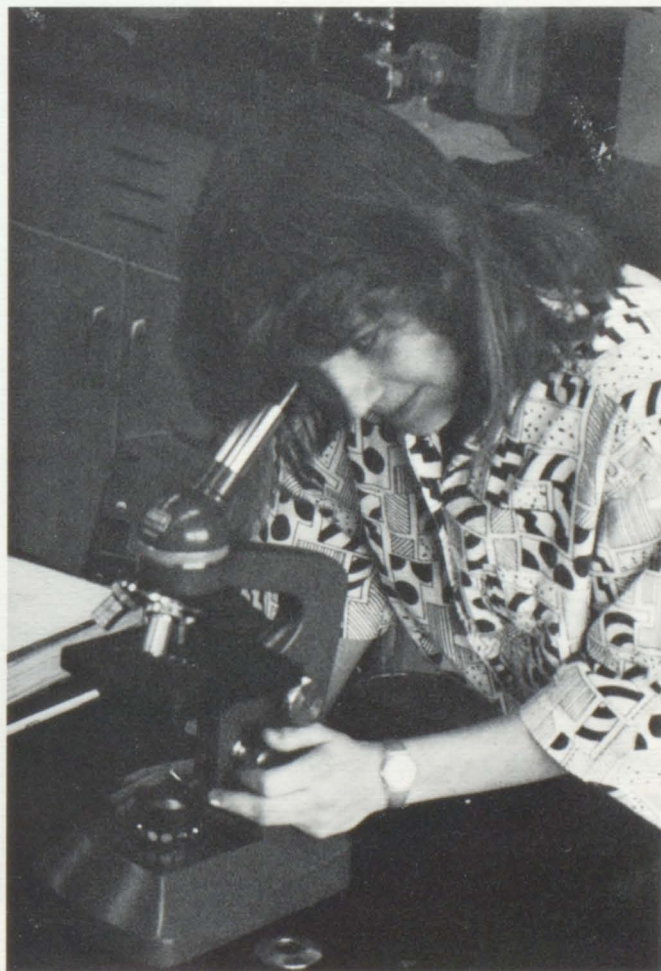
When students hear the word "Science" some think of hard tests and dissecting dead things, while other students think of exciting new discoveries and challenges in everyday life. There were many Science classes to choose from in T.H.S. this year including: Earth Science, General Science, Biology I and II, Chemistry, and Physics.

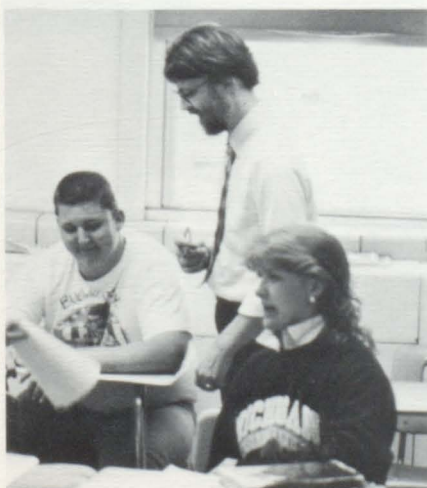

Industrial Education

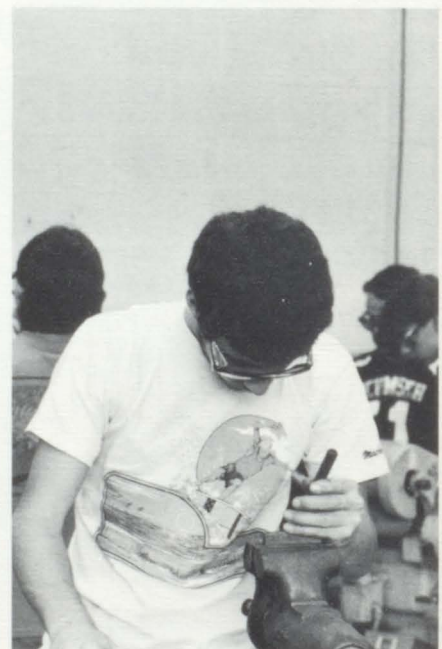

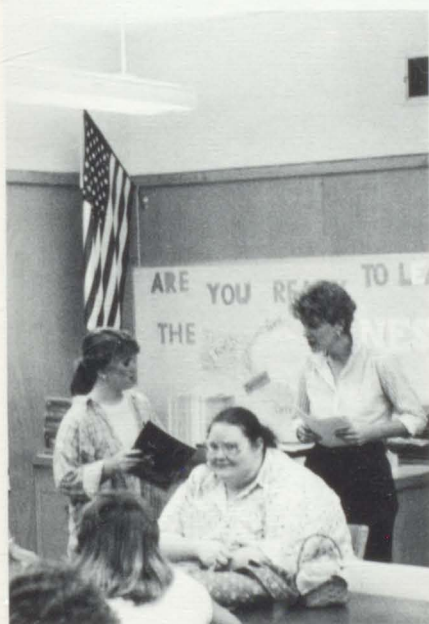

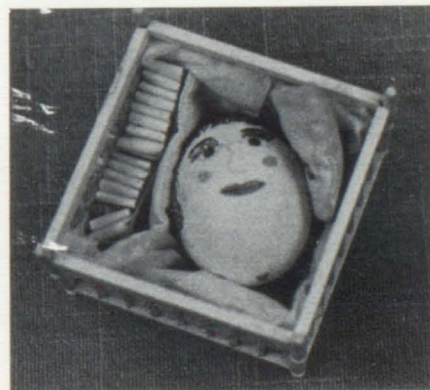
Home Economics

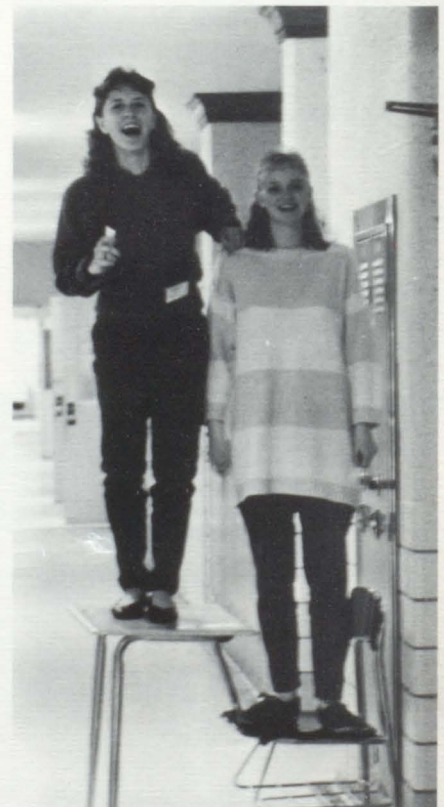

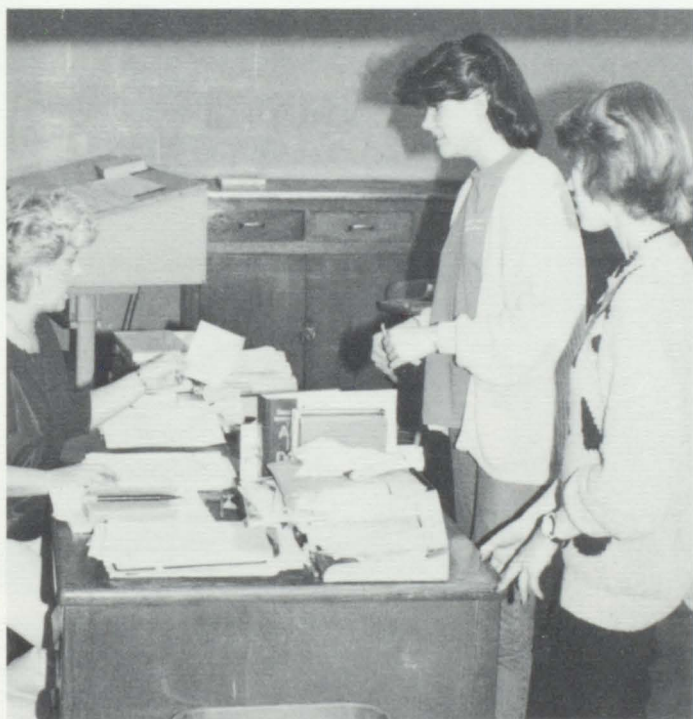

Vo-Tech is a privilege to have. We are lucky to be offered the type of training it provides.



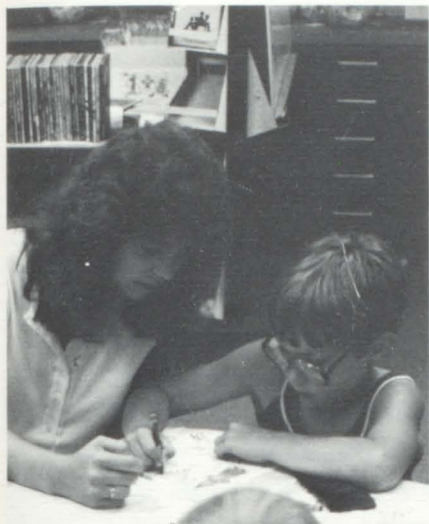

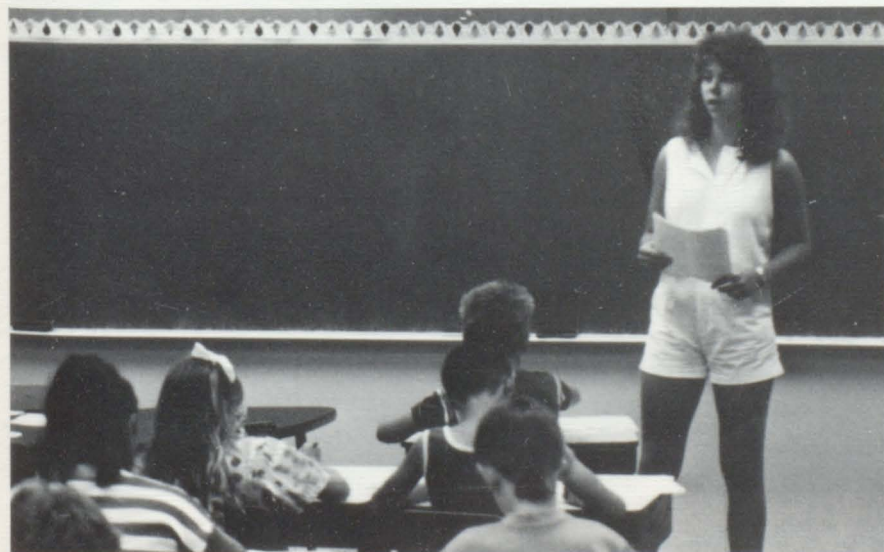

Overall, the T.H.S. Business department is an essential part of Tecumseh High School.

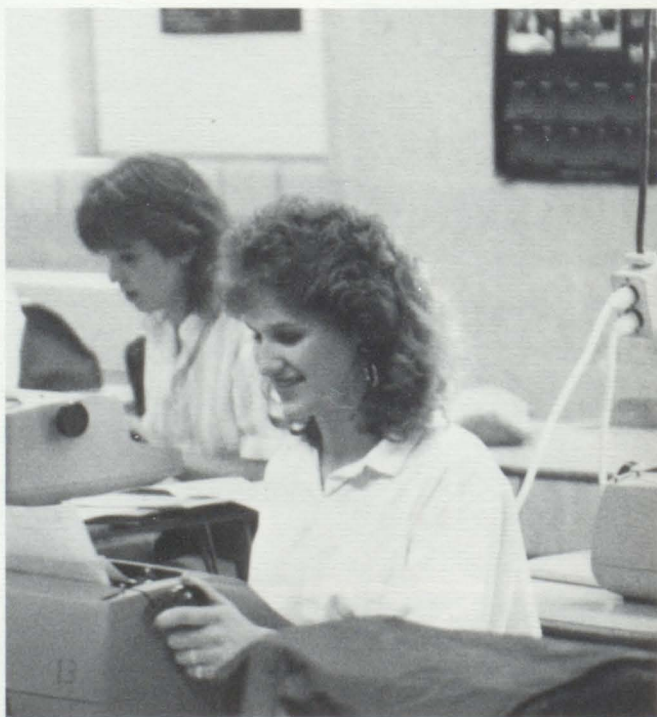

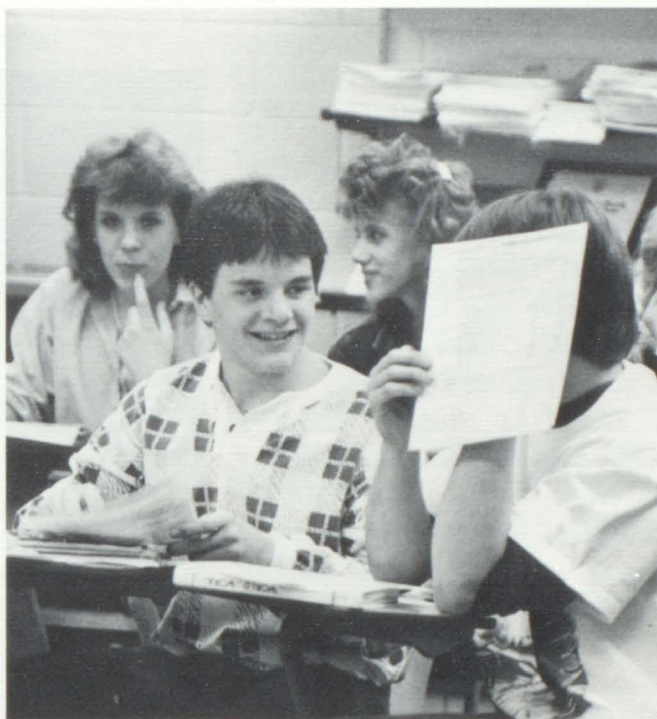
Careers

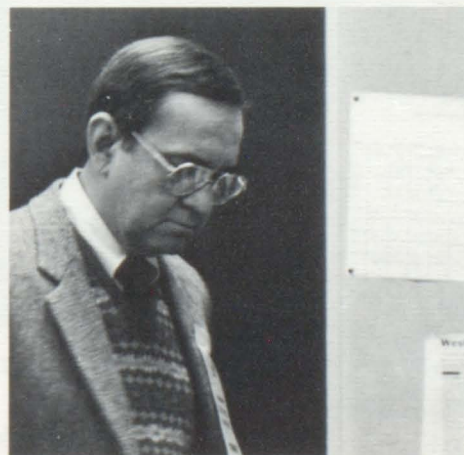

The TMS students seem to enjoy the curriculum that is offered to them. The most popular programs are tennis, volleyball, soccer, paddleball, and basketball.

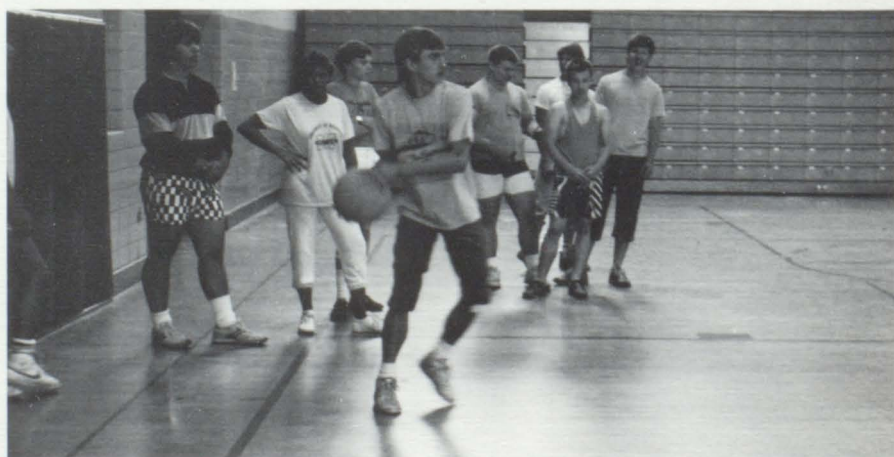
It is difficult to point out one program that students excell in, but if we had to choose one, it would be volleyball.

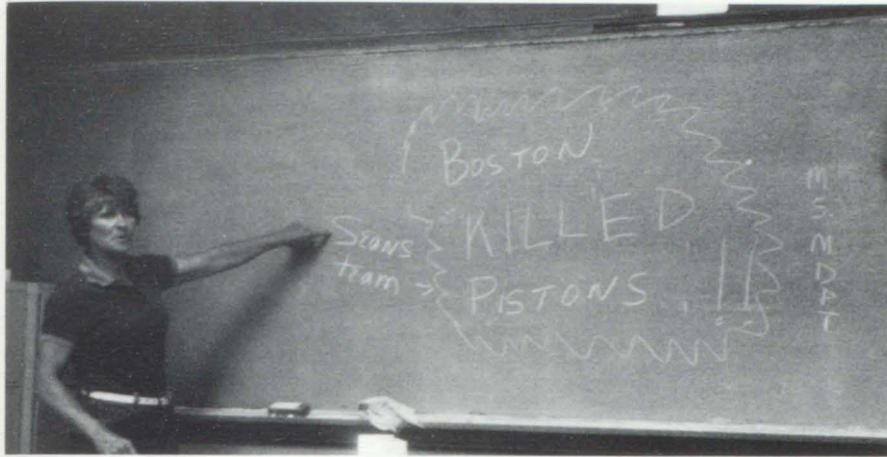

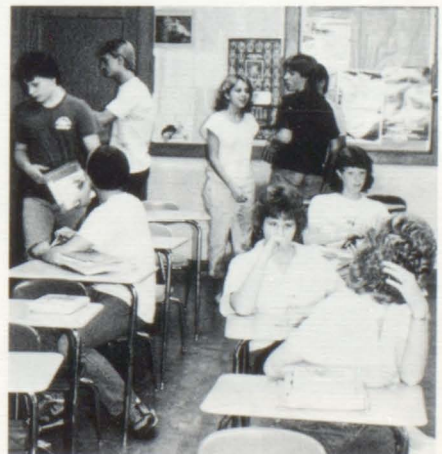

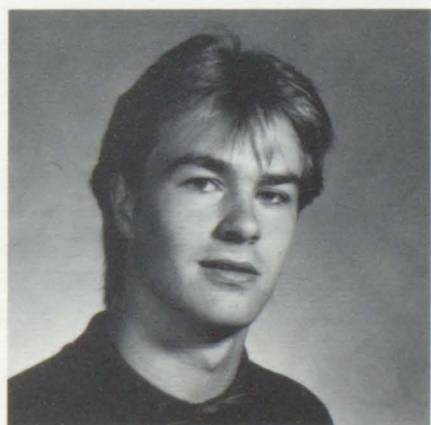

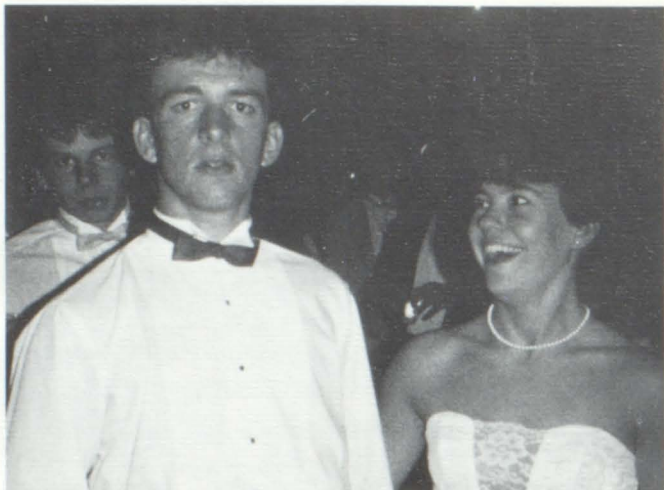

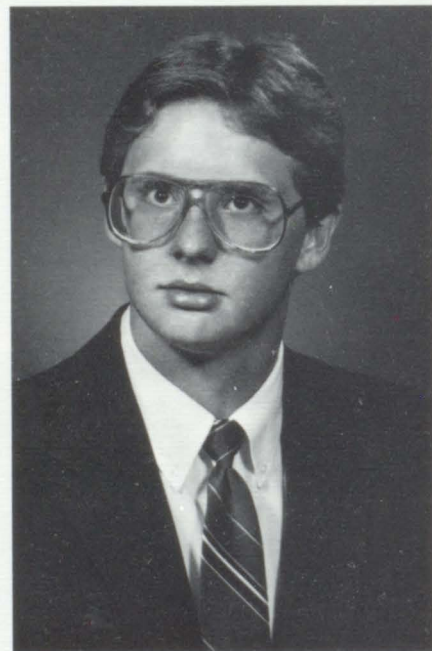

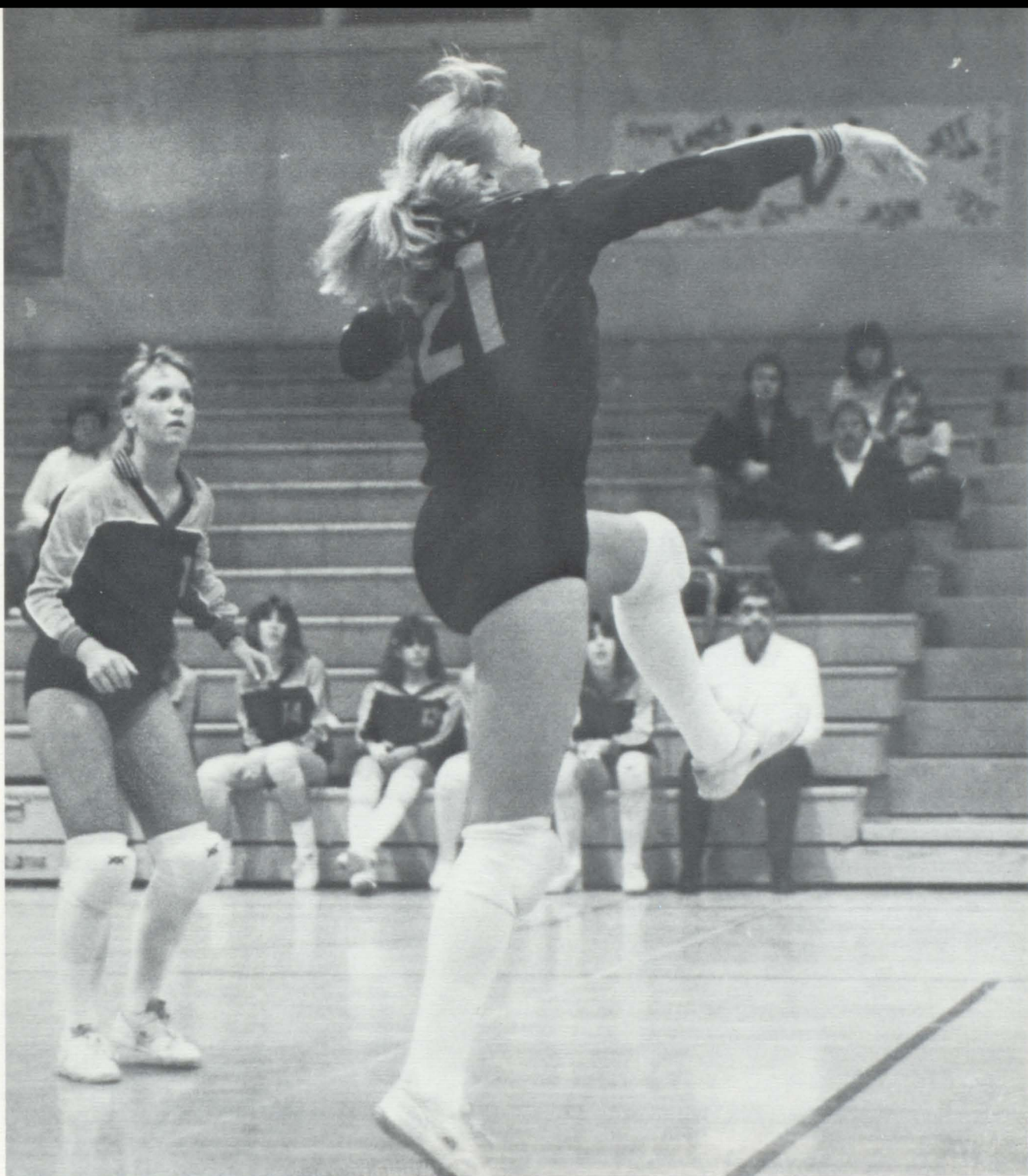

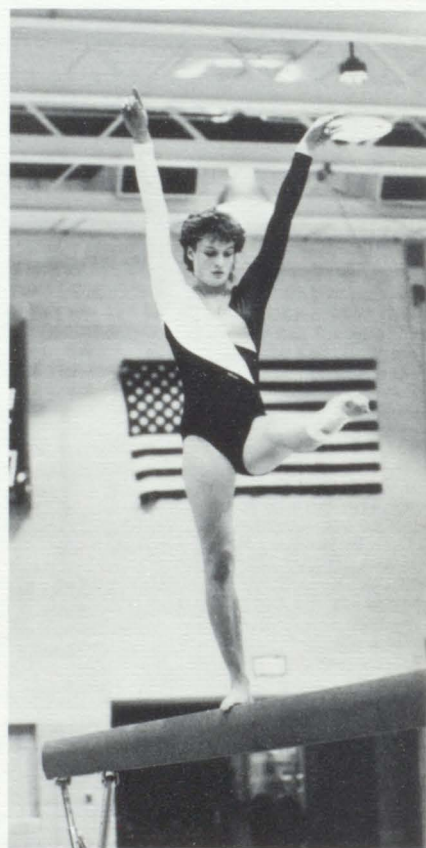

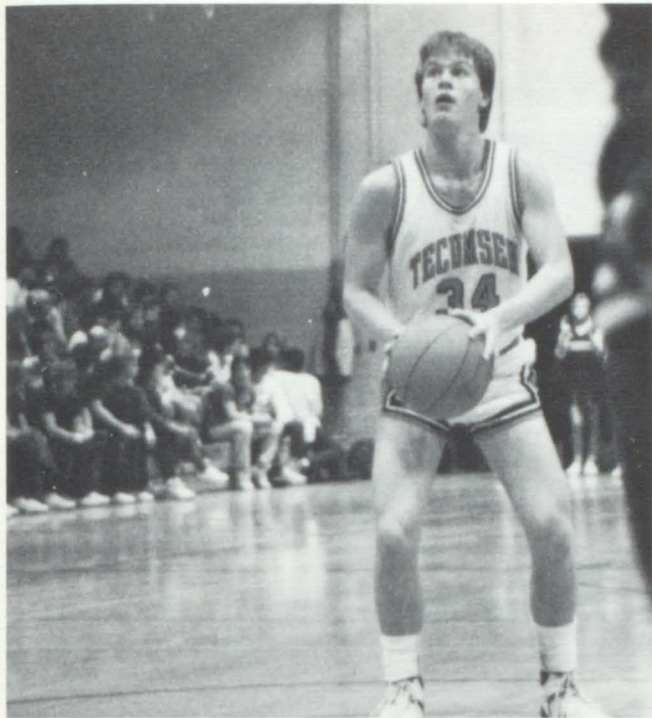

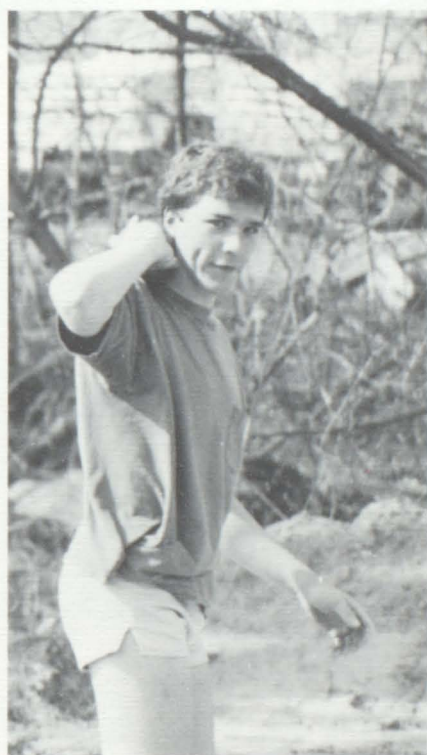

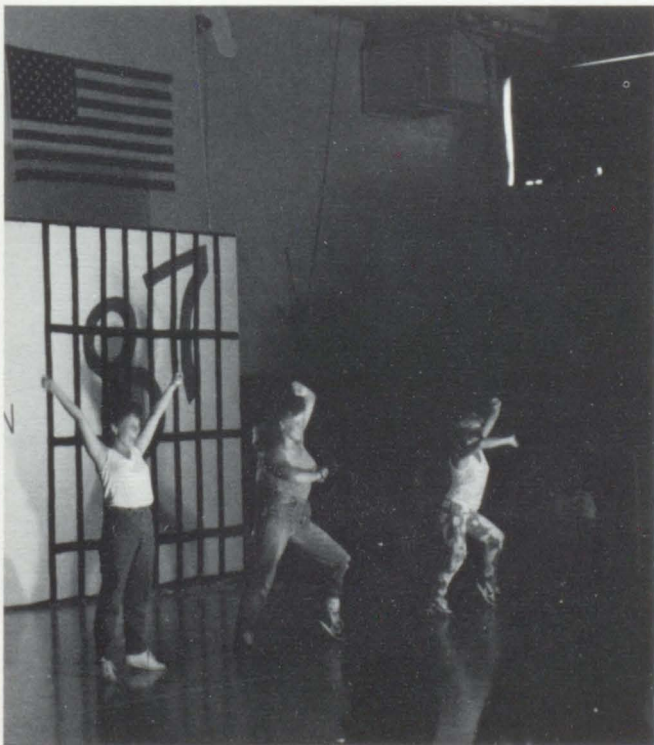
Class Night
