






Gloria Campbell is crowned queen by last year's Homecoming Zueen, Josette McWilliams, while Roy Harnish watches.









Dances were great fund raisers for school organizations and clubs. The dances generated money to support student activities while everyone had a great time.















This program is unique because it allows one on one experiences with adorable children. Cross-Age is only for Juniors and Seniors who get to help out at the elementary schools and the middle school.


Each tutor gets to select their class. The second year people get first choice. From there the learning and fun

Being a Cross-Age tutor requires responsibility. Knowing you have helped make a difference in a child's life is a great feeling!!












and Lion King.



The very talented Equations teams are coached by Mrs. Virginia Majeske. She supplied them regularly with information


which was helpful in competition. "I have learned so much this year in Equations. It has really helped me to understand higher learning math skills," said Freshmen player Brandon Bledsoe.




Equestrians









Many of these quick-footed, talented Sophomores and Freshmen will easily fill the spots of graduating Seniors on next year's Varsity team.






Varsity golf made a fine example for all THS sports with an outstanding performance record of 10-2. "There was a lot of pressure to play well and lots of


competition between the Juniors and the Seniors, "replied Freshman Ed Hunerburg.








Welcome To The Jungle







Veterans Create A Strong Team




















It's Outta Here!






The team faced the usual S.E.C. conference foes Ypsi Lincoln, Saline, Milan, Pinckney, Chelsea and Dexter, but also played





them and they were unable to get over the 500 mark, ending with a record of 1-12.






Moving Up Field











Class Nite 7alent-O-Rama




