




Dedication to Mr. Scheick

Robert LaVere Scheick was born on May 12, 1953, in Jackson, Michigan. His favorite memories as a child were spending time with his family and waking up on Christmas morning to presents; he loved hunting and fishing with his mom and dad. One of his most prized memories was participating at an annual Soap Box Derby in Jackson; he won when he was 11 years old. As he grew into his high school years, he became very active at Columbia Central High; he played football, basketball, baseball, and track. While managing his time between sports and homework, he worked at a local grocery store called Polly's. If he wasn't found there, he baled hay at a neighboring farm; he has been working since he was 14 years old. When he graduated high school, he went straight to Jackson Community College. It was there he met Susan, who became his wife in 1977. With Susan, he had two beautiful children: Ashley, who is now 23, and Tyler who is 20. Mr. Scheick earned his Associates degree while attending J.C.C. A Bachelors degree was obtained at Western Michigan University, and he received his Masters degree in teaching from Michigan State University. His post-graduate work was completed at Central. He taught for 19 years at the very school from which he graduated. The classes he taught were Science, Biology, Physical Science, Advanced Biology, Physics, Wood Shop, Metal Shop, and Math IV. Later on in life, he became the principal of Columbia Central High. His decision to transfer to Tecumseh was based on a personal choice. "I have been in Columbia all my life. I have heard many positive things about Tecumseh High School, and I wanted to explore something new, see what is out there." Some of his favorite hobbies are hunting, fishing, scuba diving, being outdoors, traveling, and riding his 2003 100th Anniversary Limited Edition Harley Davidson. When asked "What is one thing that students would find most surprising about you?" his response was one that would surprise most. "I was and still am a Deputy Seriff in Jackson on the Rescue and Recovery Diving team." Mr. Scheick has lived such an interesting life, one filled with numerous accomplishments and lots of hard work. My Battle with Cancer


My battle with cancer started in April 2005. I received chemotherapy and was in remission by August. In November 2005 my doctors saw through a scan that my cancer came back. It was very hard to hear that, but I knew that the Lord would be with me, and that he would take care of me. I immediately started treatments. They were so strong but made me very sick. The community really came together and helped my family, and I am incredibly grateful to live in a community that cares so much.

that cares so much. I lost a lot of weight my second time with cancer. I had my bone marrow trans-plant in March 2006 and usually people who have transplants like this are in the hospital for about a month. I got out in 2½ weeks. My doctors said I was the fastest recovering patient they have seen in the hospital. The community came together again and did more benefits for us, and we are so blessed with a

community that cares.
I am doing well now. I start radiation in May. I think this would have been harder if I didn't have a good relationship with God. He helped me along with my family through all of this.











SYMPHONY

Festival Singers — As the vocal competing choir, they focus and train very hard to learn how to read music. They are always a pleasure to hear, even though most of their music is in a different language.


Cross-Age





Mrs. King is the teacher in charge of the program called Cross-Age. Cross-Age Tutoring is a class pairing high school studesnts with young children in grades K-8. A tutor is assigned to a classroom of thirty or fewer students to help younger students with anything the classroom teacher asks. Some of the work includes working one-on-one with a student or answering questions that the students may struggle with. Projects and article reviews are also part of the requirements. Projects are anything a tutor feels is an academic lesson, but the teacher must agree it's appropriate. Article reviews are usually magazine or Internet articles related to children. The class is a helpful way of learning about children if tutors want to major in teaching in college or want to be prepared for later years when they are actually parents.





ACT Up!

With so many young













The Indians' final win of the season was against Dundee, scoring 58 points to Dundee's 39.






